Lara preached her first sermon two weeks ago, and will continue to preach on the rota of clergy as our seminarian-in-residence.

She is a native of Fairhope, Alabama, and has excelled in not only seminary at Vanderbilt but also at SOAR out West as well as a Youth Minister and Chaplain for years. Lara and her partner, Emily, will be a part of our parish family, and will excel in her grace, kindness and humor.

Originally from Dallas, Texas, Sadie was raised in the Episcopal church from baptism through confirmation. However, she credits her first real spiritual formation to the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Sadie completed Level I training at St. Ignatius Loyola in Manhattan in 2012-2013 and built a Level I atrium from scratch at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Teaneck. She attended Level II training at St. Margaret's of Scotland in Long Island in 2014-2015. And she was blessed to complete Level III in February 2019 at St. Jerome's in Largo, Florida with scholar, Ann Garrido. The Reverend Valerie Bailey Fischer introduced Sadie this incredible ministry and Sadie has worked with her to establish atria at House of Prayer in Newark and at General Seminary in New York.

Sadie has had the honor of watching Calvary's children grow in their relationship with Jesus in the Level II atrium since 2014 and is looking forward to ensuring that the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd continues to thrive and grow at Calvary.

When Sadie is not in the atrium, she's in the courtroom. Sadie holds three graduate degrees: a masters in African American Studies, a masters in Social Work and a Juris Doctorate. In the perfect combination of all these interests, Sadie is a Deputy Attorney General for the State of New Jersey and represents the Division of Child Protection and Permanency in child abuse and neglect cases. Her catchment area is Newark Center City. Sadie has a wonderfully supportive husband, Rob, who works overnights as a baker - which is why he seldom makes it to church with her on Sunday mornings - and two energetic kiddos: Drew, age 8, and Violet, age 3.

The Rector, the Parish Administrator, the Parish Receptionists, the Sexton, and the Bookkeeper will all continue in their roles on a long-term basis.

The Rev. Kay Locke continues as Associate Rector, and will work 10 hrs per week in pastoral care.

There are three levels of formation in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd designated by age. Children develop and change as they age; therefore, the atria are divided as such:

- **Level I, for 3 to 6 year olds in kindergarten**, focuses on the great joy and love of the Good Shepherd.
- **Level II, for 6 year olds in 1st grade to 9 year olds in 3rd grade**, focuses on The True Vine and how children maintain their places on the Vine.
- **Level III, for 4th grade and 5th grade**, focuses on the History of God's Kingdom throughout time, helping children to establish their places in this History.

There's a powerful saying that when we tell each other stories of our faith that they not only keep us and faith alive, they also tell us about who we are, what is possible for us, and about what or Whom we might call upon. They remind us we're not alone with whatever faces us and that there are resources, both within us, and in the larger world we see and in the unseen world around us -- resources already cooperating with us in our struggle to find a way to deal with whatever we are called to deal with -- resources that have ever wished to bless our lives.

As we bring these stories we hear in Church into our own life situations, they may become relevant as wisdom for the present about the greatness of being a human being and about the vulnerability of being human.

A Journey to Santiago de Compostela

31 May ~ 13 June 2020 [\$6,200]

“The Long Road to Heaven” – the annual PILGRIMAGE to the Galician city of Santiago de Compostela has taken place for over a thousand years. In the great cathedral of Santiago are said to lay the bones of St James the Great, cousin to Jesus Christ – an original disciple and later ‘resurrected’ as the legendary slayer of the Moors.

From the Middle Ages onwards, this most evocative of Christian shrines has attracted at least half-a-million pilgrims per year, who flocked from all over Europe. A network of routes leads to this holy shrine from Barcelona, across the Pyrenees and through the arid uplands of northern Spain.

Our 14-day adventure begins in Barcelona and ends in Santiago. We will visit Vic, Montserrat, Poblet, and the cathedrals of Barcelona. We then begin our journey crossing the Vall de Boi and visit San Juan de la Pena (legendary site of the Holy Grail) as we make our way to Pamplona. We side-step into the Basque region to view Bilbao, Geurnica, Santuario de Loiola, and San Sebastian. We progress... Roncesvalles, Puente la Reina, Najera, Santo Domingo de la Calzada, San Juan de Ortega, Burgos, Fromista, Sahagun, Leon, Astorga, Ponferrada, Villafranca del Bierzo, O Cebreiro, Ligonde, Vilat de Donas, and Santiago. This will be a most marvelous pilgrimage experience for all of us as a community!



Music, Art, Literature & Gardens on the Welsh-English Borders

10 ~21 July 2020 [\$5,300]

For twelve days, you are invited to discover and embrace the concept of PILGRIMAGE through an enchanted land. Centered around a journey that builds toward a specific place, this itinerary explores a number of the places that have built the character of the Welsh people in their native Celtic land and along the Borders held by English cousins. We immerse ourselves in the legacy and reality of Christian pilgrimages through the centuries in Wales - tracing life and faith from ancient to modern times.

Our adventure suggests country-homes and gardens: Buscot Park & Faringdon Collection, Madresfield Court, Althrop House, Spetchley Park, Powis Castle, Plas Glyn-y-Weddw, Attingham Park, Caernarfon Castle, and Kiftsgate Court Gardens. We will go to evensongs and eucharists at St. Melangell's Shrine, Hereford Cathedral, Chester Cathedral, Worcester Cathedral, and Shrewsbury Abbey – as well as Rug Chapel, Montgomery Church, Shobdon Church, Eardisley Church along with the pilgrim churches of the Llyn Peninsula. We will also visit St. Deiniol's Library, Cheltenham Museum & Art Gallery, Shrewsbury Museum & Art Gallery, Holst Museum, Elgar Museum, and the Llanberis-Snowdon Mountain Railway. We will stay at Ellenborough Park (5), Portmeirion Hotel (2), and The Chester Grosvenor (3).
