Deacon Carrie previously served two Christ Churches, one in the University District of Seattle, where she helped build partnerships with local businesses; and one in Short Hills, where she served as Sunday School Coordinator.

Having majored in Psychology at Hamilton College, she then received an M.Div. from Princeton Theological Seminary and a Master’s in Social Work from Rutgers University.



Originally from Morristown, she was ordained to the Sacred Order of Deacons by Bishop Carlye Hughes on May 8. Deacon Carrie is looking forward to calling New Jersey home once again and being closer to her family (especially her nieces and nephews).

IN THE INTERIM: BREATHE

Could you ever imagine that breathing would be on our minds as much as it has in the past 15 months? Patients with COVID struggled to breathe. We took care not to breathe near those not in our COVID pod. To relieve our anxiety, we were advised to breathe deeply, slowly in and out. Now finally things are opening up more than they have for months. Vaccinations have allowed us to breathe mask-free outdoors around people we don't know. Emotionally we are breathing easier, too.



The Hebrew word for breath is *ruah*. It is also the word used for spirit as in the Spirit of God. Many years ago, I asked my rector why so many Episcopal churches have red doors. The rector explained that red is the color of the Holy Spirit, and our red doors are a welcome to all to enter and honor the Holy Spirit of God. The red doors of Calvary Episcopal Church are open once again. We are back in the church celebrating Holy Eucharist. True, we are keeping our distance and wearing masks—that only makes sense. But we are singing, receiving communion, and welcoming the Holy Spirit into our lives in a direct and meaningful way.

Pandemic restrictions have eased and you may now be enjoying visiting your favorite restaurants and places of recreation that have been closed to you. Certainly, those feed your body and your mind and even your spirit. On Sundays at Calvary, you can feed your soul. If you have been coming to church, it has been a joy to see you. If you haven't been coming, why not? There are certainly other places where you can breathe in the holy *ruah*—the Holy Spirit. But in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist it is not only promised by our Lord Jesus Christ, it is guaranteed. The red doors are beckoning.

The truck has done all this and more, for the community of Calvary Church.

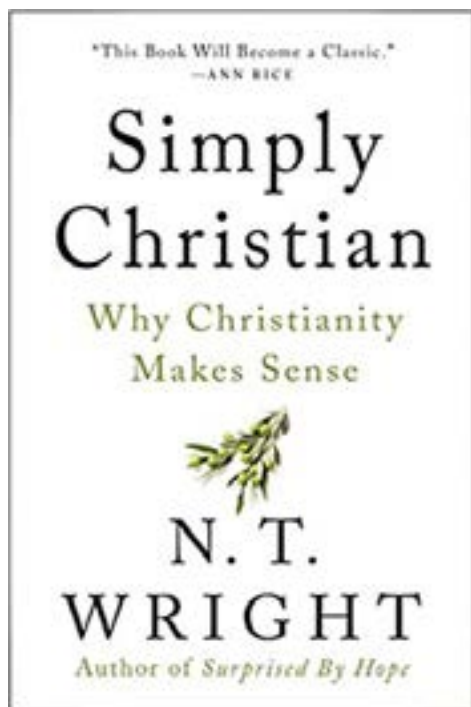

We also received positive news that Mother Melanie has created an ad hoc committee to search for a new organist. There was already a promising lead at the time of the meeting and further progress has been made since.

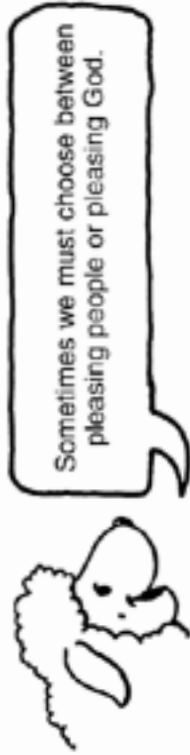

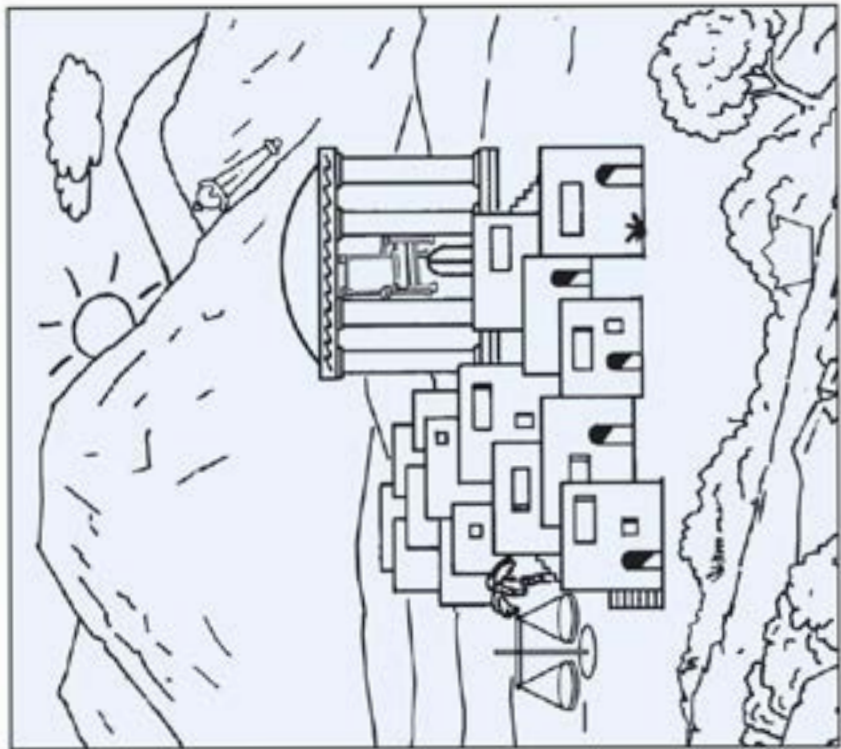
