**IN THE INTERIM**

The search for a new rector . . . and you. After the strangest year and a half in church history, the Vestry is now actively working with Canon Margaret Clark on the process of finding the next rector for Calvary Church. Canon Clark is the assistant to the Bishop for transition ministry. The process will look very different from those in the past. The National Church has revised the process to reflect the technologies and sociological changes of the 21st Century. More about that when information is available. You have a part to play.

As the parish creates its profile, or portfolio as it is now called, one of the questions asked is the average Sunday attendance. That's hard to figure out for this year given that there were no in-person services until April. Then there was summertime when Calvary folks joyfully got outa' Dodge. Now we can begin to get a picture of who are the members of Calvary by those attending Sunday services. In order to show the vibrancy of the parish, it is important that you be in church.

We are often reminded that every vote counts. In church circles during the search process, every head counts, or rather every soul is counted. That's even more to the point. It is good for your soul to come to church every week. When you reestablish the habit of receiving the Holy Eucharist every Sunday, you receive healing and strength. If you have children, sharing the gift of your faith is as important as any life lesson you can teach them. Even if they sit there apparently bored and distracted or if they are playing with Busy Bags, God's grace finds its way in. In the 168 hours that you have in a week, the one set aside for God has the potential of reaping the greatest rewards.

The portfolio also indicates the programs available in the church and the participants. There are many ways to give a bit of your time to Christ's ministry in the world through Calvary. We are told that volunteering is healthy for us. You might consider what will give you joy in serving God and others through this parish. The portfolio will also ask about pledging. As members of Calvary, this is not only an easy way to show your membership and commitment; it is also a concrete way to give thanks to God. I like to say that it puts legs on our gratitude. Calvary Church doesn't have a money tree out back that can be shaken to take care of the bills. The income is derived solely through you, the members of the church. Many members of Calvary chose not to make a pledge for 2021. Through careful fiscal management and frugality—and by necessity dipping into savings—the parish will cover its expenses. But if you want to help to paint the very best picture of the parish, it will be important that you make a pledge when asked.

Perhaps some people are waiting for a new rector for Calvary to be a lively, engaging, serving, and thriving parish. It is all of that right now though numbers would be hard-pressed to show that. I like to say that in 25+ years of priestly ministry I've been around. This is a lovely parish and, though I will have nothing to do with the search process, it is my fervent belief that as more of you become more fully engaged, you will attract just the right person to lead this congregation.

## THE MUSIC CORNER

Concerts have returned to Calvary! On Saturday, October 16, we hosted Seraph Brass, who played a dynamic and wonderfully varied program of transcriptions and original works for brass quintet. The audience was treated to movements from operas, piano works, and orchestral suites played by the five brass players. They also programmed original, contemporary works that beautifully showed off the abilities of each instrument. If there was any doubt what a gorgeous space our sanctuary is for making music, the audience were reminded by Seraph.

The five women who performed also spoke eloquently and passionately about each piece, giving the audience the perfect amount of information to enrich their appreciation of each work. It was great to see them interact so professionally and personally with the audience in addition to being top-notch performers.



At the time of writing, the next concert Calvary will be hosting is on Saturday, October 30, at 6:00 pm. I will be playing a Halloween-themed organ concert interspersed with scripture readings for the All Hallows' Eve service from the Book of Occasional Services. There are several readers who will give dramatic readings of some spooky scripture passages, and I will be playing music to match them. There will be both original organ compositions and transcriptions of orchestral works and songs from musicals. It is guaranteed to be a fun evening - so, if this newsletter reaches you in time, come and celebrate Halloween with us!

Finally, I will be away from November 1 through 6, because I will be back in Indiana to defend my dissertation. Once I do that, I will be done with my doctorate. My dissertation is an in-depth analysis of Messiaen's *Méditations sur le Mystère de la Sainte Trinité*, focusing on the history, theory, and theology that went into this nine-movement work. When I return, on All Saints' Sunday, I will play the final two movements as voluntaries, one of which fittingly uses the Gregorian Chant Alleluia for All Saints' Day. It will be a privilege to share this portion of my doctoral work with you immediately after completing my doctoral requirements.

October was a busy month! You could feel the energy returning to the Calvary campus as we hosted a variety of activities. We kicked off the month with the Blessing of the Animals, held the Seraph Brass Concert on October 16 (the first concert since the onset of the pandemic), enjoyed great participation in both our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and youth program and, at the time of writing, we anticipate closing out the month with a Halloween Concert and children's costume parade. As we look towards the end of the year, we plan to continue our momentum with Advent activities, our annual Christmas pageant and several opportunities for Calvarians to give back to our community. ### September Vestry Meeting Highlights

Many of our October activities were discussed and planned during the September vestry meeting. Below are some additional highlights.

■ Mother Melanie summarized her discussion with Canon Margo Clark, Transition Office of the Diocese. Due to changes in technology and people in the ministry, the process for calling a new rector has changed. Instead of a Profile/Search Committee, the Wardens and the Vestry are in charge of the process. This makes sense because canonically it is the Vestry that calls the next Rector. This will be a focus for Calvary's vestry in 2022.

■ Susan Favate, who leads property stewardship, detailed the damage Ida did to the basement of the Parish Hall. Even though the sump pump worked, the basement flooded because it was overwhelmed by the amount of water. The insurance adjuster noted that the drywall absorbed a lot of water and will need to be fully or partially removed. We are waiting to hear from the adjuster about how much insurance will pay.

## CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

What is faith formation? How does faith develop in your heart and mind? Did it seep in through the repetition of prayers and hymns as I sat on hard pews in itchy tights week after week as a child? Something touched my heart in that space and in those words, but I had no idea what was going on up there on the altar. I completed First Communion and Confirmation. I memorized the Lord's Prayer and the Nicene Creed, but I felt like an actor in a play. I went to Vacation Bible School and I participated in the Christmas pageant. But I had no idea how to read the Bible or what I was supposed to take away from these stories.

Although I lacked confidence in my understanding of my faith, it was rooted deep within me. And after a few meandering years of college and young adulthood, Jesus called me back to the church for the sacrament of marriage. Before I knew it, I had a toddler. And frankly, I began to panic. What was I going to teach him about faith? How could I answer his questions if I didn't know the answers myself?

Imagine that you are three years old. Leave all of your grown-up worries at the door. Forget everything you've been taught



about religion. Take off your shoes and walk quietly into a very special place that has been prepared just for you. The furniture and the materials are all the perfect size for your little three-year-old body. The artwork is hung right at your eye level. Everything is prepared and organized. The room is calm and quiet. In this room, you choose which material you would like to work with and no one interrupts you. There are no right or wrong answers. There are no teachers to please. Here, you are introduced to the Good Shepherd. He is the teacher. But, you sense that you already know Him. You've always known Him. He is already in your heart. His love is complete and unconditional. He calls you by name and you know the sound of His voice. His love is something you understand quite well. And from that love, from that relationship with the Good Shepherd, the mysteries and the customs of our faith unfold around you.

Training to become a catechist in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program was a beautiful and life-changing experience. I learned a lot of truly basic things that I'd never known before – like the seasons and colors of the liturgical calendar and the names and purposes of the gestures of the Eucharist. I learned typology and the parable method and what prophecies are all about. But, I also reconnected with my faith in a new and profound way. I learned how to wonder. I continue to grow in my faith each week as I work with the children in the atrium because they have incredible insight and they continue to teach me.

Formation for our children is crucial to their own development as wonderful little humans and to the health of our parish and the Episcopal church for years to come. And luckily (and selfishly) for us adults, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is not an altruistic sacrifice of time and energy, but rather, a wellspring of spiritual renewal. I encourage anyone and everyone – those with young children and those without – to consider training to become a catechist.




